

Interested in learning about how different countries provide psychological and social services? Come to Rome this summer and study with students and faculty from around the world!










COURSE INFORMATION

- Course title: International Approaches to Social Issues
 - We will focus on how different countries address common social issues, including child welfare, aging, and substance misuse.
 - Students and faculty from Italy, Czech Republic, the US, and potentially Korea and Peru, will attend
 together and learn from each other.
- It is a three credit summer course students pay for the course like any other summer course.
- It is a hybrid course the first part will be asynchronous online. The second half will be the 10 day course IN PERSON in Rome. BOTH parts are required.
- Dates for the IN PERSON in Rome are: July 6-16, 2025.
- All classes will be in English.
- The deadline for course registration is April 10th, 2025.













HOUSING/FOOD INFORMATION

- Students stay at the CUA Rome Center
 - The costs for staying at the Rome Center are estimated to be \$1000 per person for the room and breakfasts and lunches.
- At the Rome Center
 - There are singles, doubles, and triple rooms available. Students can choose, but may not be guaranteed their first choice. It will depend on availability.
 - Meals are included in the \$1000 payment. Breakfast and lunches are served and the staff can accommodate virtually every dietary restriction.
 - There are also refrigerators and microwaves available at all times.
- The Rome Center is a fully gated campus in Trastevere with 24 staff/security.
- There is free laundry, Wifi, and printing.
- It is walking distance to MANY restaurants, grocery stores, cafes/bars (which is a cafe in Italy), public transportation, parks, and easy access to the main sites of the city.

THE SHORT-TERM TRAINING PROGRAM IN ROME WAS MORE THAN JUST AN ACADEMIC EXPERIENCE; IT WAS A VALUABLE OPPORTUNITY TO EXPLORE AND COMPARE SOCIAL WELFARE PRACTICES ACROSS DIFFERENT COUNTRIES.

BY ENGAGING WITH PROFESSORS AND SCHOLARS FROM VARIOUS NATIONS, I GAINED FIRSTHAND INSIGHT INTO HOW CULTURAL BACKGROUNDS INFLUENCE WELFARE SYSTEMS.

I ALSO REAFFIRMED THAT SOCIAL ISSUES ARE NOT CONFINED TO A SINGLE COUNTRY BUT ARE SHAPED BY COMPLEX SOCIAL, ECONOMIC, AND HISTORICAL FACTORS ON MULTIPLE LEVELS.

IN PARTICULAR, I WAS STRUCK BY THE NECESSITY OF ADOPTING A MULTINATIONAL PERSPECTIVE RATHER THAN A SINGLE-COUNTRY APPROACH WHEN ADDRESSING WELFARE CHALLENGES.

THIS EXPERIENCE HAS REINFORCED MY COMMITMENT TO RESEARCHING AND PRACTICING SOCIAL WELFARE WITH A BROADER, MORE GLOBAL OUTLOOK, STRIVING TO DEVELOP SOLUTIONS THAT

TRANSCEND NATIONAL BOUNDARIES.
